From the Golf Course Superintendent

Greetings from Golf Course Maintenance!

As promised, I will review the remainder of the Golf Course Condition survey and hopefully address the concerns. This is great information that will help us plan projects and agronomics for the golf course. Thanks for your responses.

There were quite a few comments in regards to our tees being unlevel. This is due to years of divot sanding that creates a crowned hump in the middle of the tee box. To counteract this build up we strip the turf, re-level the subsoil and replace the sod. We have done this over the last couple of summers on several tees most notably the forward tees on #5, #6 and #18. San Juan CC is very lacking in terms of total teeing space and the visiting USGA agronomist previously recommended we expand teeing space where possible. In the past 3 years, we have expanded by mowing or actual expansion on 14 of our 18 holes. More tee leveling is planned for 2011.

Fairways were the next area surveyed. Most of the respondents believe our fairways are in Good to Excellent Conditions. As we enter our third season of intensive aeration they should only get tighter. Progress on the fairway thatch problem has been encouraging as was exhibited during the hot days of summer when many less dry spots popped up. We will aerate the fairways completely in late April to early May this spring. Additionally, we have sand topdressed on the traditional thatch fairway areas around the course.

Bunkers, according to those returning information, are the #1 concern about the golf course conditioning. Statistically you were split on the bunkers with 17% saying the bunkers were 'Excellent' and a similar 15% calling them 'Unacceptable', the rest of responses were in on the fence. With that high of number of members concerned with the sand traps coupled with the comments, we realize this is a priority for the club. Many commented that sand conditions have always been poor here. The primary reason is probably due to the local affordable sand. While at this time switching to a better quality sand (this was reviewed by the Golf and Greens Committee in 2009) is not in the cards we have made progress by adding drainage and using chemical treatments. Over the past 3 seasons we have added subsurface pipe drainage to about 1/3 of the existing sand traps while bunkers on 14, 15 and 16 were constructed with modern drainage. This along with a chemical treatment called 'Eximo' has helped the bunkers to dry and to not develop a crust. We will hopefully have the resources to add sand to any traps deemed to not have the 4 inches recommended by the USGA.

The final item of discussion in the state of the golf course was the rough areas. Several members stated that the rough seemed too long the past season but I would like to assure you we have the machines set at 2 inches as in prior years. We have made a speed adjustment to the big area rough mower that slowed it down and produced a cleaner, better cut later in the 2010 season. We are leery to lower the rough below the 2 inch mark due to the amount of raised tree roots here that would surely damage the mowing blades and cause down time. We will mow several specific areas one extra time every week to aid in finding lost balls. If there are any of these heavy rough areas you know of that are of concern let me know. Overall the membership believe the rough is 'Acceptable' to 'Good' but we will strive for 'Excellent' in the future.

We had a new guest at our last meeting, Margaret Armstrong, our new Club President. I must admit she is much more attractive than Rick Trost. Congratulations to Margaret for her recent election as President. We had two other guests at our meeting, Patty Ausbrooks and Elaine Heikkinen, and as always stated we welcome member participation at our meetings. I thank Margaret because I think these two ladies came because of her attendance.

The Treasurer's report reflected some serious uses of cash, primarily from the flood damage and also some requests for some payoffs on the member loans. We are okay but need to report that we have to be very conservative going forward to maintain a proper cash balance.

It was reported that we should close on lot #440 in February that will net us approximately \$70,000. Shooting Par Properties, LLC is completing a beautiful home that has had a lot of interest and we are hoping to sell that soon.

Once again, we have been dealing with our attorney, Scot Hatcher (in Santa Fe), concerning the flood damage. We are having some cooperation with HOA in Phase II and with Cheney-Walters-Echols. No input from the City.

Our water rights issues are still paramount in that we must protect our water interest in order to preserve the golf course as we know it.

Any of you that have given thoughts about signing the "quit claim deed" please do so. If you have questions in regards to this matter give me a call (860-4482) and I can assure you that there is no loss and no cost by signing the deed. So far we have approximately 50 which is considered good, but we would like to get ourselves up to about 75.

We are also working on another water rights issue, the San Juan Basin, which has to do with the settlement between the US Government and the Navajo Nation. This also is complicated requiring legal assistance to make sure that we are protected.

Mr. Richard Cheney, Development Board member, has been extremely helpful in this in that with his work in Santa Fe he is very knowledgeable on the various issues. Our thanks to Mr. Cheney for keeping us abreast of these important issues.

New Business: we elected officers, David Aldrich, Secretary; Ron Dial, Treasurer; Ron Fellabaum, Vice President, and Ben Heikkinen once again as your Development Board President. I thank my fellow Board members for serving in these offices and believe me we do important work for the Country Club.

A special thanks to Marlo Webb for handling the Treasurer's position during a very difficult time. Major loans, serious cash flow concerns, and a new bank to train – and an inordinate amount of detail handled in a first class manner!!

Meanwhile, we hope everyone is preparing for the end of winter and a good spring. See you around the Club.
