March begins the “transition” to the new golf season. It also marks my one year Anniversary at San Juan Country Club. Last month I outlined several items of interest from the Golf Shop and this month I’d like to get more specific!

GOLF SHOP: Golf accessories such as golf shoes, gloves, golf balls and of course equipment will begin to find their way into the golf shop at the beginning of March. NIKE golf shoes, equipment from Cleveland Golf and Taylor-Made, and gloves from both Taylor-Made and NIKE are arriving too!

WEATHER PERMITTING! I will hold a Cleveland Golf and Taylor-Made Demo Day, on Saturday March 19th; beginning with a 1:00 Golf Clinic. We’ll go for 30-45 minutes with the clinic; giving everyone a review of the setup, grip and my approach to the swing. After the clinic I will work with as many of you as possible; to find a driver, putter, wedges, or other equipment needs that you may have early in the golf season. I will have all the DEMO equipment from Cleveland and Taylor-Made.

MGA WEDNESDAY NIGHT GOLF LEAGUE! Sign up is well underway, and heading towards my goal of 30 teams, (60) players. The concept of the league is to bring members of all “groups” together; early in the golf season, motivated by a great format, and promoting comradere! The Wednesday Night Golf League will do this for everyone involved; and give members the opportunity to win early season Golf Shop \$\$\$\$\$. GOLF INSTRUCTION: I follow a few, very simple philosophies in my teaching, as well as, in my own approach to playing the game:

♣**SCORE= “TALENT” - “INTERFERENCE + OR - LUCK!** *This equation applies to every golfer of both genders; at all levels of abilities. If you are curious, stop by the Golf Shop and I’ll give you a quick talk on what this all means to YOU!*

♣**(4) skills needed to play this game: the POWER SWING of the driver; the PRECISION SWING of the iron game, the PARTIAL SWING stroke of the pitching and chipping game, and lastly the PUTTING STROKE!** *Simply put; if you can understand how these 4 strokes are played, work on those specific skills; and learn to navigate the course with YOUR SKILLS, you will play your best golf!*

♣**Impact, the position of “impacting the golf ball”** *may be the most standardized piece of the golf swing. TOUR players, good amateurs and club members, at impact,..... are all the same! Using good fundamentals will help you to arrive at impact more consistently, more often. I teach IMPACT when I teach the fundamentals of the golf swing.*

♣**A good golf swing, with a great short game will produce great scores.....and great scores are all relevant to what your current abilities are!!!** *A great golf swing, DOES NOT guarantee a great score.*

I am available, weather permitting, for golf lessons anytime. I will list the specific programs in April’s Newsletter. Golf Instruction should, as much as possible; be structured, regular, and with feedback to the student from the instructor. Do IWill I give “corrective” golf lessons? Absolutely yes! Not everyone has the time and energy for “developmental-coaching” instruction. I will be happy to give you that 45 minute individualized golf lesson that will help you to play better immediately. COME SEE ME, AND LET ME HELP YOU TO A BETTER GAME, AND BETTER SCORE IN 2011!

The Professional Staff will be locating 2011 cart licenses onto your personal carts over the next several weeks. You can help us with this by indicating your need for the license you were billed for last month. Also, many San Juan CC bag tags have not made their way onto member’s golf bags. Please help us get you, your bag tag. They are in the Golf Shop!

Your Golf and Greens Committee, as well as, your Board of Directors have passed a new schedule of GUEST GOLF FEES FOR 2011. Lower fees will REWARD MEMBERS who have been consistently bringing guests to the club. Also; when our guest play trails off, there are great incentives for bringing guests to the club late in the afternoon! Times will vary according to when the sun sets, but in the peak of the season, the price breaks occur at 4:00 p.m. & 6:30 p.m.!!!!!!

♣**Premium Fees:** Guests playing without members; and Outside Events

\$55 weekends ♣ \$45 weekdays ♣ \$12.50 (cart)/player 18 holes

♣**Weekend Fees:** \$49 plus \$12.50 (cart) = \$61.50

♣**Weekday Fees:** \$39 plus \$12.50 (cart) = \$51.50

♣**After 4:00 :** \$25 plus \$12.50 (cart) = \$37.50

♣**After 6:30** \$19 plus \$6.25 (cart) = \$25.25

We are passing on savings to you in guest fees during “prime-time” and encouraging members to bring guests to the club during our “down” times! We hope you take advantage this golf season, bring guests to the club, and **SAVE MONEY!**

Greetings from Golf Course Maintenance

San Juan Country Club has the goal of aiding members in a quality of country club life that is unprecedented. The first area of expanded service is improved golf cart maintenance. We seek to make communications and repairs as quick and pain free as possible so we are looking at adding another full time mechanic to help Tony. Whether you have an electric or gas golf cart we can solve most problems and have several specialized parts distributors to order from. This pricing list is not meant to be all-inclusive and every case is different so if clarification is needed contact the Proshop. Tony's rate for labor is \$30 per hour for 2011. We also have relationships with Robinson Golf Cars (Montrose, EZGO) and Southwest Ag (Bayfield, Yamaha) if work cannot be completed in-house so we can seek other assistance.

Cart Mechanic 2011 Billing

Batteries

Change single battery	\$20 flat rate plus parts
Change 6 batteries; <i>straight switch out</i>	\$90 flat rate plus parts
Change 6 batteries <i>with battery rack cleaning/paint</i>	\$190 flat rate plus parts
Replace & clean <i>battery, posts, and wires</i>	Per hour charges plus wires
Replace drive belt or alternator belt	Per hour charge plus parts

Brakes/Pedals

Adjust brakes	\$35 flat rate
Replace brakes	\$35 flat rate per side plus parts
Adjust and repairs of gas/brake pedals	\$85 flat rate plus parts

Tires/Rims

Tire replacement <i>(off old and on new)</i>	\$20 per tire flat rate plus tire
Tire sealant for slow flats	\$15 per tire flat rate

Basic troubleshooting and diagnosis are billed out as per hour labor plus any parts. Motor computer/controller work as well as Welding, Charger, & Electrical Work are also billed as per hour charges plus parts. We can tune up your gas cart for a \$65 flat rate plus parts, ask the Proshop for details.

From the Golf Course Superintendent, Cont'd

San Juan Country Club Landscape Services

The second area where we are expanding our services is in the area of offering labor forces to help you at your home with small landscape projects. The Golf Course Maintenance Crew will be happy to help you with your small landscape and maintenance projects as time allows and as labor is available. Some of the work we can do includes weeding, shrub trimming, and other general landscape cleanup. Sorry, but we by law cannot apply chemicals on your property. Here are the details and guidelines of how this works.

1. Golf Course Maintenance and Projects **always** take priority over private work requests; priorities will be left to the discretion of the General Manager, Golf Course Superintendent, and/or their representatives.

2. Call and leave a message at the Golf Course Shop at 327-4451 x 30 to schedule work. Please do not call on weekends even though work can be scheduled for the weekends.

3. Billing will be through the Country Club Main Office and your Member Account.

Billing rate for 2011 is \$20 per hour per general laborer; Superintendent & Assistants time billed at \$35 per hour. Billable time will be rounded up to the nearest ½ hour.

Billing rate for debris hauled/disposed will be \$20/yard of material (about one work cart)

Billing rate for Tractor or Skid steer per hour is \$35 plus operator. This covers wear and tear and includes fuel. (e. g. Laborer/Operator at \$20/hour + tractor = \$55 per hour.)

Other billing rates and adjustments are at the discretion of the GM and Superintendent.

4. **Lot cleanup** in 2011 will range from \$120-180; upcharges are discretionary.

Driveway snow shoveling by hand is \$30 flat rate; again upcharges are discretionary.

Lawn aeration will be \$50/hour with a one hour minimum; owner marks sprinklers.

All this talk of fried chicken is making me hungry. Here's a simple soup recipe to go along with you next fried chicken dinner.

Roasted Sweet Corn Soup

- 5 Ears corn-cut from husk
- 6 Medium Shallots
- 3 Stalks Celery
- 1 Carrot-peeled and chopped
- ¼ C Garlic
- 1 T. Thyme
- 3 Potatoes-peeled and chopped
- 1 Qt. Heavy Cream
- 1 Gl. Chicken stock
- 1 C. White wine

Sauté shallot, carrot, and celery in pot until translucent. Add thyme, corn, potatoes, and corn cobs. Deglaze vegetables with wine. Reduce by half. Add stock, and simmer on medium flame for 45 min. Salt to taste. Add heavy cream, bring to a boil, and remove from heat. Blend until smooth.

Eat well, moderation is over rated!


